Nearly one billion people lack access to clean water.


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
This means walking up to 6 hours to gather water from polluted ponds, streams, or hand-dug wells. These water sources are often shared with animals and go dry for months. Waterborne diseases are widespread, and children must endure dangerous walks that cause them to miss school.



























In 2022, we hope to provide clean water to an additional 8,000 people, reaching three new communities, four schools, and a hospital.

## JAMES LEITNER - BIO

To symbolize the distance women and children must walk every day to find water, James has undertaken a number of attention-grabbing endurance challenges. These include: walking 3,250 miles from New Jersey to California while pulling 10 gallons of water, running 30 miles for 30 days in a row, and numerous other challenges meant to build attention and awareness.

Through collaboration and consultation with international development organizations, James built MissionCleanWater to deliver world-class projects to communities that are the most vulnerable and in need. He dreams of the day when everyone in the world will enjoy this basic human right.
